- Recognized for our generous contributions to regions across Virginia, HumanKind was awarded a 2019 *Lighting the Way Award* by the SunTrust Foundation.

YOUR GENEROSITY BROUGHT CLAIRE INTO THE LIGHT, AND CHANGED HER LIFE.

Claire had never been to school, she had barely ever had the opportunity to leave the apartment. Not until a truancy officer appeared at her door did the school system even know she existed in the home. The officer came looking for her older brother, and what they found was Claire; an autistic girl age 8 who was non-verbal and still wearing a diaper.

Quickly all the children in the home were removed and Claire was placed with one of our longest and most experienced treatment foster care families. Here she would start to receive the help she needed to grow and develop. Without early intervention for autism, Claire was functioning on a 2-3 year old developmental level. Within one year placed with our foster family, Claire was able to function much closer to her age level and was beginning to thrive.

After years of neglect and intervention for autism, Claire wasn't able to communicate with caregivers and much like a toddler struggled with frustration and acted out with tantrums. Coming into foster care, Claire underwent assessments for how to best give her the care she needed.

It is because of you and your support that over the next several months she began receiving occupational therapy, physical therapy, and speech therapy. Soon she was able to attend a specialized school for children with autism. "Right before she left our care for adoption, Claire looked at me and said for the first time 'Hello Kim'. It just melted my heart to see her grow that much receiving the care and therapies she needed all along".

A BRAND NEW START

For years, Victoria had been a good employee at Goodwill and her supervisor wanted to offer her a promotion to sales manager for increased wages, more responsibility and recognition for a job well done. Unfortunately, reliable transportation was a critical piece to this position. To meet the required schedule, she would not be able to rely on public transportation or friends to get her to and from work.

Because of you and your support, the doors at Ways to Work were open to Victoria when she had nowhere else to turn and wanted to make changes to better support her family.

By coming to Ways to Work, Victoria had a program specialist to walk alongside her in this journey and work with her one-on-one preparing her to qualify for a car loan. After 2 years of preparation and hard work, Victoria's loan was approved.

"With Ways to Work I have been able to move up in my job. I am now a sales manager. The best part is now my daughter can participate in Girls on the Run."

For the first time, Victoria had reliable transportation. She could make sure her children got to school on time, and support other members of her family. Now her daughter was also able to participate in after school activities.

This car has completely changed Victoria's life. Now, this mother of 5 has so much self-confidence and joy. Her family has hope for the future. Together they are thriving.

Just weeks after getting reliable transportation, her supervisor revisited the opportunity for a promotion. And this time, she confidently accepted.

THE MOTHERHOOD COLLECTIVE

HumanKind officially acquired The Motherhood Collective® (TMC) at the start of 2019. In a joint effort to increase collective community impact, this addition has brought greater opportunities to educate, equip and empower individuals and families in Virginia and beyond.

TMC focuses on maternal health by providing free expert-based education and social support programming to women from preconception through postpartum. This service has beautifully complimented the care, counseling and education Humankind has offered for over 100 years.

Their eight educational and support programs have moved to the historic campus and has expanded offerings making it easier for the community and for families to access support; critical to building family support.



2019 HIGHLIGHTS:

- New HumanKind flagship office opened in Richmond to better meet community needs by bringing area services and programs together.
- **Foster Care** program expanded to serve Northern Virginia and opened a new office in Danville extending reach into the Southside region.
- Ways to Work provided financial education, and loans to 1,394 people with 88% reporting an increase in financial stability. More than 180 loans were approved totaling \$1,186,683.
